Junior Scholarship Award

The NSDTRC (USA) Junior Scholarship award is intended to recognize young people for their varied interests with their dogs and to encourage well-rounded participation in all facets of dog ownership. The Junior Scholarship award is designed to acknowledge hard-working juniors with a passion for dogs.

An award will be given each year by the NSDTRC (USA) to a junior who in the eyes of the NSDTRC (USA) board of directors most fulfills the participation in several facets of dog ownership.

The Scholarship Chairman will be responsible for publicizing this award and for soliciting applications. The Chair will review all applications and will send the resumes to the Board Liaison for Board distribution and decision.

A plaque will be purchased and engraved with the name of the winner. The plaque will have a brass plate on which will be inscribed:

NSDTRC (USA) JUNIOR SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

In addition, the Junior Scholarship Award shall include a check for \$250.00. The name and social security number of the winning junior must be supplied to the NSDTRC (USA) treasurer at least 6 weeks in advance of the National Specialty.

Qualifications:

1. The junior must be between 10 and 18 years of age for the year they are being nominated.
2. The junior, his/her parents, or sponsor must be a member in good standing of the NSDTRC (USA).
3. Consideration will be given to any dog-related activity with a Nova Scotia Duck Tolling Retriever, such as, but not limited to:
 - a. Any AKC event: conformation, obedience, tracking, agility, field trials or hunt tests.
 - b. Any NSDTRC (USA) club field tests (BRT, WC, WCI, WCX).
 - c. Any academic endeavor such as a term paper/computer presentation on the history of Nova Scotia Duck Tolling Retrievers or school assembly speech on dog ownership.
 - d. Community service, such as nursing home visits, obedience demonstrations in the community.
4. The junior, or his/her sponsor, must submit to the Junior Scholarship Chairman by June 30 the scholarship application and a written account of the junior's qualifications and accomplishments for the previous year.
5. Where applicable, copies of titles, certificates, grades, letter of appreciation, etc., should be submitted with the nomination to verify authenticity.
6. Emphasis will be on excellence in a broad spectrum of activities.
7. A junior may win this award only once.
